III.—DIGEST OF THE CENSUS RETURNS OF GREAT BRITAIN AND IRELAND, 1861.

THE following Appendix comprises a digest of the information contained in the Census Returns for 1861, the Poor-Law Reports, and other Government Blue Books, so tabulated as to supply at one glance a statistical survey of the United Kingdom, and at the same time so arranged as to furnish a ready means of ascertaining the minute particulars of local interest attaching to each separate city, borough, town, village, parish, ecclesiastical district, and hamlet. To achieve this result, no little amount of labour was requisite; for although the materials were all supplied by the Government Returns, the means of reference were often difficult, and the information scattered through many volumes. Even to those who have the whole of the Government Reports on their shelves, it is hoped that these tables will prove of service; for they will here find a list of all places in the United Kingdom arranged alphabetically, with their several descriptions, as city, borough, town, parish, &c., the days on which markets are held, the county and union in which situated, with the population and the extent or area in statute acres, with the exception of a few parishes in Scotland, for which the Ordnance Survey is not yet completed. In the case of Ecclesiastical Districts, the area is not stated in the Census Returns, their bounds being often undefined, so that the population only can be given. In the lists of Poor-Law Unions, the rateable value of property is given from the new valuation Returns so far as revised up to April, 1867. At the close of each English entry, a number is affixed indicating the Registration District and Union within which such place is situated, and by which it may be found in the Population Returns and Poor-Law Reports; but the express object of inserting these numbers here is to refer the inquirer at once to the place in the preceding tables of Poor-Law Unions where he will find the Union within which such place is situated, with the rateable value of property in 1867, the number of inhabited houses in 1861, the total amount of poor rate levied in 1866, the proportion expended in relief to the poor, in-maintenance and out-relief, and the total amount expended, including county rate, borough and police rates, &c., compared with the area and population. No numbers have been affixed to the Scotch and Irish places, because the former are grouped, not under unions, but counties, and in Ireland the unions are arranged alphabetically under provinces and counties.

‡ In computing the per-centage of increase between 1831 and 1841, the military, included for the first time in the population given for the latter year, are left out of the account. So also, in computing the rate of increase between 1841 and 1851, the seamen and others on board vessels in the ports, returned with the general population in 1851 for the first time, are excluded.

§ Sta. denotes that the population was nearly stationary; the minus sign (—) before the rate denotes that the population, instead of increasing, decreased at the stated rate.

|| The alterations made by the Reform Act of 1867 are indicated by the signs (+) plus and (—) minus, the former signifying that the number following it is to be added to the existing number of members, and the latter that such number is to be subtracted, to give the number of members as fixed by the Reform Act of 1867.

¶ Previous to the passing of the Reform Act of 1867 only four members were returned for the Universities, viz., two for Oxford and two for Cambridge, but one is in future to be returned for the University of London, and one for the Scotch Universities.

** Cities and towns in England and Wales which are counties of themselves:—Berwick-upon-Tweed, Bristol, Canterbury, Carmarthen, Chester, Exeter, Gloucester, Haverfordwest, Kingston-upon-Hull, Lichfield, Lincoln, London, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, Norwich, Nottingham, Poole, Southampton, Worcester, and York. The county of the city of Coventry was annexed to Warwickshire by the Act of 5 & 6 Vict. c. 110, which passed 12th August, 1842.

†† Of this number 115,353 were foreigners, and 154,439 were undistinguished; but if we assume that the numbers whose nationality was not ascertained were distributed proportionately over the rest, the above summary will be obtained.
